



Macrame Christmas Tree

- measures approx 24 cms in length

Materials

- 5 metres 4mm 3 twist cotton cord
- 1m ribbon



1. Cut six cords each measuring the following lengths
1.2m, 90cms, 80cms, 60cms, 50cms, 40cms
2. Fold the 1.2m cord in half and tie an overhand knot
about 5cm from the fold. (this is your hanger)
3. Row 1 - Take the 90cms cord and lay it horizontal to
the two vertical cords 1.5cm down from the overhand
knot. Make sure this cord is centred on the overhand knot. Work from the centre and tie a horizontal
double half hitch to the right. Tie a horizontal double half hitch to the left
4. Row 2 - Take the 80cms cord and lay it horizontal to the four vertical cords 1.5cm down from row 1
Make sure this cord is centred on the overhand knot. Work from the centre and tie two horizontal
double half hitches to the right. Tie two horizontal double half hitches to the left.
5. Row 3 - Take the 60cms cord and lay it horizontal to the six vertical cords 1.5cm down from row 2
Make sure this cord is centred on the overhand knot. Work from the centre and tie three horizontal
double half hitches to the right. Tie three horizontal double half hitches to the left.
6. Row 4 - Take the 50cms cord and lay it horizontal to the eight vertical cords 1.5cm down from row 3
Make sure this cord is centred on the overhand knot. Work from the centre and tie four horizontal
double half hitches to the right. Tie four horizontal double half hitches to the left.
7. Row 5 - Take the 40cms cord and lay it horizontal to the ten vertical cords 1.5cm down from row 4
Make sure this cord is centred on the overhand knot. Work from the centre and tie five horizontal
double half hitches to the right. Tie five horizontal double half hitches to the left.
8. Trim the ends to your desired length and comb the fringe out (fig 2) OR gather the end cords together
with a gathering knot using one strand of the twisted cotton (roughly 40cm). Then trim the tassel and
comb it out. (fig 1)
9. Weave the ribbon through the spaces between the rows. You can cut the ribbon for each row (fig 2)
or weave it continuously (fig 1)
10. Tie a bow in the space between rows one and two.
